From Vienna International Airport: Direct trains every hour (08:03, 09:03 etc), takes 1:40h, € 47.40 (one-way).

From the City of Vienna: Either Hauptbahnhof (Vienna Main Station) or Westbahnhof (Western Railway Station). Several direct trains per hour, takes 1:15–1:19h, € 39.30–40.49 (one-way).
